## *Tomatoes*

~ If White Fly is a problem, plant Marigolds and Basil nearby to help repel insects. Tobacco users should not come in contact with seedlings to prevent tobacco virus. Planting Radishes, Rue, and Pennyroyal will repel many insects.

~ Days indicated after each variety are from when plants are set out in the garden to ripe fruit. Indeterminate habit will require staking. Determinate habit may sometimes require caging.

~ Lycopene is a carotenoid that is abundant in Tomatoes and makes them red. It is a strong antioxidant and is helpful in preventing cancer. Processed and cooked tomatoes in sauces are more easily absorbed than raw tomatoes.

~ Increase your yields and fruit size by 2-4 oz. by growing on stakes or cage.

~ For your selection of disease resistant varieties, we have indicated after the variety the strength of the disease resistant; V = Verticillium resistant; F = Fusarium resistant; N = Nematode resistant; T = Tobacco Mosaic resistant.

**D-Determinate:** seldom needs staking but good to cage; blossoms and fruit develop on vine at same time and harvest lasts only a few weeks.

**I-Indeterminate:** best to pole or stake; blossoms and fruit develop progressively, and harvest lasts several months.
